Litter pickers



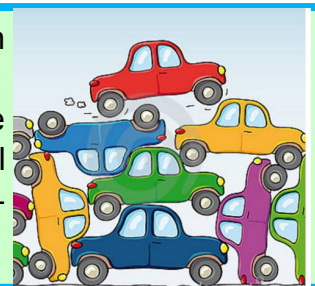
