

<u>Free School Meals—</u> Please can we remind parents that if you qualify, then to please apply to receive free school meals. Free school meals are available for your child(ren) if you receive one of the following qualifying benefits: <u>Apply Here</u>

- Income Support (IS) or Income Based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- An income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs) that as of April 2012 does not exceed £16,190.
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit
